Susan G. Komen for the Cure Health Care Advocacy

Susan G. Komen for the Cure is well known as the nation's largest not-for-profit source of funds for breast cancer research.

In addition, the Foundation's local affiliates raise money and provide grants to area health care providers such as the DuPage County Health Department, DuPage Community Clinic, and the Robert Crown Center for Health. These grants are used toward education, breast cancer screening, and treatment of the medically underserved.

What may not be as well-known is that the Foundation also has a grassroots advocacy program to educate Congress, federal officials, state legislators, and other policy makers about breast cancer.

Top priority for the Chicagoland Affiliate is advocacy for laws to help the underserved women of Illinois receive the treatment they need. Chicagoland Affiliate President Pat Rowland will provide an overview of proposed Illinois legislation to provide access to quality breast cancer screening and treatment for all Illinois women.

Discussion will focus on issues raised in Chapter 2: "European integration: looking ahead."

In the 50 years since its founding, the European Union has become a single integrated market, with a single European currency, and a major legislative force in many areas of economic and social life--such as environmental policies and gender equity.

New challenges are arising as the EU discusses expanding its membership to include Muslim countries in the Balkans--and especially, Turkey.

For the new U.S. presidential administration in January 2009, what will be the impact of new EU policies on European citizens and existing national policies? Should the U.S. support European policies? Oppose them? Emulate them in the U. S.? Promote bilateral cooperation with Europe?

Chapter 2 presents for us a good background of facts and a thoughtful discussion.

Consensus Question: Should there be an Illinois Constitutional Convention?

Background material on the Constitutional Convention question that will appear on the November ballot has been widely disseminated in various League publications and on our website. (See last month's *Shop Talk*, the *Illinois Voter* and the LWVIL website <http://www.lwvil.org/ConCon.asp>)

Now it is time for our League to get together to discuss the pros and cons of the issue. Our consensus will be added to those of the rest of the Leagues in Illinois and the state board will vote on a position.
