Council recognized the Illinois Chapter President of the American Planning Association, who presented the Daniel Burnham Award for Elmhurst's Comprehensive Plan, citing land use, transportation and economic development.

Mayor DiCianni read the Radon Proclamation and urged the Public to have homes tested for presence of radon.

Daniel Cusack, a resident of the new hospital neighborhood, spoke once again about unresponsiveness of the hospital to neighbors concerns over traffic and landscaping issues.

In other business, Mayor DiCianni congratulated Fr. Joseph Siegel, Pastor of Visitation Church, who is stepping up to become an auxiliary bishop in Joliet, and the new Pastor of Lutheran Redeemer Church, Rev. Stiegemeier, and expressed a desire to see Council meetings begin with a prayer, led by clergy of various faiths, on a rotating basis.
