Ald. Jordan sat in for Mayor Marcucci, whose plane was delayed by weather. He arrived at 8:25.

Meeting was preceded by swearing-in of two new police officers, and promotion of a detective to sergeant.

**Accounts Payable** dated January 15, 2007, totaled \$700,487.24. Highlights included:

- DuComm, quarterly share, \$46,107.
- DuPage County Treasurer, repaving services, \$40,000.
- DuPage Senior Citizens Council, grant for home delivered meals; senior citizen home maintenance, \$18,750.
- DuPage Water Commission, fixed costs and water consumption, \$170,333.
- Elmhurst Claims Acct., self-insured loss fund, \$17,448.
- Elmhurst Ford, three new police vehicles, \$54,300.
- Triggs Construction, Inc., 2005 contract paving program, \$20,632.
- Walter Daniels, Churchville one-room schoolhouse, \$177, 825.

**Consent Agenda** included the following:

- 06P-07Harris Bank, 0S524 Old York Rd. Facility will contain four drive-thru lanes and a branch bank. Property will be annexed to City.
- Extension of contract with Winkler's Tree Service, for removal of Dutch Elm diseased trees \$395,056.
- Sanitary sewer CIPP lining project, \$950,000.
- Design architectural services for Churchville one-room school, \$42,000.
- Replacement of yield signs with stop signs, Kenilworth and Crestview intersection, per request by neighbors.
- Elmfest 2007 Chamber of Commerce request for change in layout of entertainment venue to Addison St., and an admission charge of \$1.00.
- Request from Tannins Wine Shop for creation of a new WWB category of liquor license, limited to purchase of wines and premium beer, packaged and by the drink. \$3000 annually.

0-01-2007 Council approved Ordinance to transfer old library building (Wilder Mansion) from City to Park District. City will pay \$450,000 to provide for necessary improvements to electrical, sprinklers, elevator and related work.

Packet included information about proposed pedestrian underpass/tunnel for York High School, including the following:

- 28 accidents have occurred at the site in past three years.
- Field is used throughout the day, by classes and for parking access.
- Many students do not cross St. Charles using the light.
- Funding has not been worked out.
