Mayor Marcucci introduced members of the Youth Commission at York, who recently attended Legislative session in Springfield, where they participated in proceedings regarding the death penalty. Also, Mayor recognized and awarded members of the Peer jury at York, who heard 30 cases this past year, all but one with successful outcomes.

A citizen presented 158 petitions to the Mayor regarding hazardous conditions in a neglected underpass near Jefferson School.
