The meeting was preceded by a Public Hearing regarding annexation of seventeen lots on south Prospect, in area of new hospital site. There were no speakers. Due to a recent death of one owner, the hearing will continue on Sept. 4<sup>th</sup>.

**Accounts Payable** dated July 31, 2007, totaled \$1,925,526.74. Highlights included:

- Allied Waste Services, refuse collection and waste disposal, \$2250,027.
- Brothers Asphalt Service, street resurfacing and patching, \$303,259.
- Down Under Construction, storm sewers, rear yard drainage program, water service upgrades and repairs, \$26,415.
- DuComm quarterly shares, \$145,950.
- DuPage Convention and Visitors Bureau, municipality dues, \$10,391.
- Health Care Service Corp., health insurance, \$297,964.
- Metropolitan Life Insurance Co., dental insurance, \$19,562.
- Neri Construction Co., storm sewer improvements, \$22,852.
- Texor Petroleum Co., gasoline, \$19,575.
- West Central Municipal Conference, Spring '07 trees, \$117,364.5.
- Winkler's Tree Service, Inc., Dutch Elm Disease tree removal, injections \$127,623.

**Consent Agenda** included the following:

- Reclamite application program, \$0.55/sq. yd., to be applied over 11 miles of asphalt, \$75,000.
- Elmhurst Artists' Guild art festival, York St., Sept.8.
- Installation of No trespassing signs along Union Pacific (CNW) railroad right-of-way to encourage pedestrians to cross tracks at designated crossings only.

Council pulled and discussed report of Public Works and Safety Committee's position on student parking in the College View area. Seventy-four residents petitioned for restricted parking in streets near York High School. Citing administrative and enforcement complications and the setting of a problematic precedent, the Committee voted to deny the petition, and Council agreed. Alderman Gutenkauf voted nay.

Council discussed at length the Hahn St. proposals. The three developers under consideration were narrowed to two, as Council voted unanimously to drop Everett Builders, whose member were not present and did not submit a requested plan revision. Remaining developers are Morningside and Gammonley.
