Council recognized the members of the Immaculate Conception High School football team and their coaches, who came from losing four games to win State Championship. The team included a female kicker, first ever to score at a State championship game.

**Public Forum** heard from Daniel Cusack, who raised concerns about the location of doctors' parking lot at the new hospital, which will bring 150 to 200 vehicles per day to Harvard St.

**Consent Agenda** included the following:

- 0-36-2008 Creation of Special Service Area on west side of Willow Rd. between Gladys and Crestview, to fund sidewalk, parkway, trees, etc.
- General Ordinances were passed to renew services to special service areas and for levying of taxes, and abatements.
- Request from Cricket Communications for extension to 90 feet of tower in Industrial district, 211 Spangler.

Mayor Marcucci announced formation of bicycle task force, made up of all nine applicants and several City officials. They will begin working immediately.

Council discussed Senate bill 2083, passage of which will allow Governor to withhold funds from local governments- a move which would send us further into budget and service cuts.
